# **DVD Operations Manual Features**

Thank you for purchasing the Faroudja DV1000 High Resolution DVD player. The DV1000 represents the realization of performance goals set by Yves Faroudja to design a DVD player offering state-of-the-art video and audio processing that takes full advantage of the phenomenal performance available on Digital Video Discs and audio CDs.

### Advanced Video Features

- High performance component (Y, Cr, Cb) video outputs with BNC type connectors.
- Professional quality components for increased video bandwidth; greatly improving image detail.
- A patented Faroudja custom ASIC (Application Specific Integrated Circuit) Detail Enhancement is added to Increase the apparent bandwidth of the picture providing a greater level of detail. Four levels are available.
- Precise time alignment of both the component and S-Video signals.
- Dual optical laser pickup for optimum digital tracking of either DVDs or CDs.
- Increased flexibility with selectable syncon-green plus TTL or Video sync selection.

- Advanced digital audio reclocking technologies are applied to significantly reduce clock jitter. This results in superior audio resolution for audiophile performance from both CDs and DVDs. A sophisticated optically decoupled phase-lock-loop 48KHz Voltage-Control Crystal Oscillator is used to timefilter the digital audio stream.
- Audiophile grade digital outputs: ST-Glass optical, calibrated AES/EBU balanced XLR and 75-ohm coaxial.
- Direct PC-board mounting of coaxial and ST-glass outputs eliminates Internal cable reflections after reclocking circuitry




7. Cleaning

Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.



3. Grounding or Polarization

This product may be equipped with a polarized alternating current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the



outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.

8. Power-Cord Protection

Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the product.



4. Ventilation

Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating, and these openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked




### 12. Attachments

Do not allow the product to output distorted sound for a long time. It may cause speaker overheating and fire.



### 13. Accessories

Do not place this product on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table. The product may fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the product. Use only with a cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table recommended by the manufacturer,



or sold with the product. Any mounting of the product should follow the manufacturer's instructions, and should use a mounting accessory recommended by the manufacturer. ### 19. Headphones

Do not use a cracked, deformed, or repaired disc. These discs are easily broken and may cause serious personal injury and product malfunction.

# **Precautions**

### **Notes on Handling**

- When shipping the DVD video player, the original shipping carton and packing materials come in handy. For maximum protection, repack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.
- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect spray, near the DVD video player. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the DVD video player for a long time. They will leave marks on the finish.
- The top and rear panels of the DVD video player may become warm after a long period of use. This is not a malfunction.
- When the DVD video player is not in use, be sure to remove the disc and turn off the power.
- If you do not use the DVD video player for a long period, the unit may not function properly in the future. Turn on and use the DVD video player occasionally.

### Notes on Locating

When you place this DVD video player near a TV, radio, or VCR, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, place the DVD video player away from the TV, radio, or VCR.

### **Notes on Cleaning**

Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning.

- For stubborn dirt, soak the cloth in a weak detergent solution, wring well and wipe. Use a dry cloth to wipe it dry.
   Do not use any type of solvent, such as thinner and benzine, as they may damage the surface of the DVD video player.
- If you use a chemical saturated cloth to clean the unit. follow that product's instructions.


### To Obtain a Clear Picture

The DVD video player is a high technology, precision device. If the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn down, the picture quality becomes poor. To obtain a clear picture, we recommend regular inspection and maintenance (cleaning or parts replacement) every 1,000 hours of use depending on the operating environment. For details, contact your nearest dealer.

### **Notes on Moisture Condensation**


Moisture condensation damages the DVD video player. Please read the following carefully.

Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the DVD video player.



### Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases.

- When you bring the DVD video player directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the DVD video player in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.
- In summer, when you use the DVD video player in a hot and humid place just after you move the unit from an air conditioned room.
- When you use the DVD video player in a humid place.



### Do not use the DVD video player when moisture condensation may occur.

If you use the DVD video player in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc, connect the power cord of the DVD video player to the wall outlet, turn on the DVD video player, and leave it for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the DVD video player will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the DVD video player connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.

Installation

# Unpacking

The DV1000 package should include the following items:

■ DV1000 Transport

Owner's Manual

■ Registration Card

■ Infrared Remote Control

■ Composite Video Cable

S-Video Cable

■ BNC to RCA Adapter

Save all original packaging material. After unpacking the DVD1000, check to see that the AC voltage marked on the unit (120 VAC or 240 VAC) conforms to your national standard.

Warning: Failure to confirm the appropriate voltage setting can result in damage to the unit.

Please complete the registration card to ensure notification of future design upgrades and new products, as they become available.

If the unit needs to be shipped, be sure to remove the disc from the transport tray. Turn off unit with the front panel power switch. Wait 20 seconds before disconnecting power. This gives the disc transport time to move into a locked position.

# Installation

The DV1000 can be mounted either in a rack type installation or set on a shelf. For rack mounting, first install the rack "ears" to the sides of the unit with the screws provided. Screws for attaching the DV1000 to the rack should be supplied by the rack manufacturer. The ears can support the weight of the DV1000. However, a rear support should be added if the rack is subject to movement or excessive vibration.

# **Video Connections**



### DV1000 Rear Panel

The DV1000 offers four types of video signal outputs: **component** (Y, R-Y, B-Y also called Y, Cr, Cb), **RGBS**, **S-video** and **composite**. To obtain the highest quality image, use of the component video output is recommended. The television must be capable of accepting this type of signal. RGB and RGBS will also yield superb results. For televisions or video processors that do not accept these formats S-Video and composite video outputs are offered.

COMPONENT CONNECTION: Switch the Mode Selection switch to the Y, Cr, Cb position. Using a high performance three wire 75ohm cable with BNC type connectors, connect each cable to the Y (for the black and white signal), R-Y (for the red signal) and the B-Y (for the blue signal). Connect the other end of the cable to the video monitor or Faroudja Line Processor. Be sure to connect the correct cable to the corresponding input connector or else the image will produce incorrect colors.



RGB OR RGBS: Switch the Mode Selection Switch to either the RGBS or RGB positions to match the system

connection.RGBS (Red, Green, Blue, Sync) requires the use of four high quality 75ohm cables. RGB adds the synchronizing signals to the Green channel for use with three wire video distribution systems. The RGBS should be used for most installations.



**S-VIDEO OR COMPOSITE:** The video signal on the DVD disc is recorded in the Y, Cr, Cb format. Using the S-Video or, especially, the composite signal requires additional processing in the DV1000 to recombine the Y, Cr, Cb signals resulting in some loss of signal bandwidth. The outputs are offered on the DV1000 for use with older televisions or for use with a second television.



ANALOG OR TTL SYNC SELECT: Some displays require the type of synchronizing signals used with computers (TTL +5 volt). In most cases the Analog (-4 volt) position should be used. This switch only affects the RGB output.

# **Audio Connections**



DV1000 Rear Panel

The DV1000 offers audiophile performance and features for both DVD and audio CD playback. High performance Digital to Analog converters are used in the DV1000 for the analog outputs. However, to produce maximum fidelity the digital outputs should be used for connection to a high performance external processor.

### ST-Glass

The ST-Glass optical outputs provide the highest quality signals available. Connect the optical cable to a high performance external processor that offers digital to analog conversion and AC-3 or DTS decoding.

### **AES/EBU** balanced XLR

Connect a high-quality wide-bandwidth 110ohm twisted pair XLR cable to the input. Although not required, the cable may be shielded.

### Coaxial

Use a high quality wide bandwidth 75ohm cable.

### AC-3 — PCM/Analog Switch

The **AC-3 position** should be used if an external 5.1 channel AC-3/DTS digital surround sound decoder is used. In this case, the Analog Audio outputs (Left and Right) are disabled and all digital audio outputs carry AC-3, Linear PCM or DTS bitstreams for DVDs; linear PCM bitstreams for ordinary CDs and DTS bitstreams for DTS Digital Surround CDs.

The PCM/Analog position should be used if the external equipment consists of an analog stereo receiver or preamplifier (with or without Dolby Prologic decoding). In this case, the analog audio outputs carry a stereo or Dolby-Surround compatible two-channel mix-down of the 5.1 channel AC-3 digital audio signal for DVDs, and a two channel stereo analog signal for ordinary CDs. The Digital outputs carry two-channel Dolby surround compatible linear PCM bitstreams for Dolby Digital DVDs, linear PCM for ordinary CDs and DTS bit-streams for DTS Digital Surround CDs. The Analog outputs cannot be used for DTS CDs (you will hear only noise), in which case an external DTS decoder must be connected to one of the digital outputs. There is no advantage to using both a digital processor and an analog receiver/ preamplifier with the DVD player. Unless your equipment configuration changes, there should be no need to change the switch position after initial installation.

# Front Panel Operation



### Front Panel

The front panel of the DV1000 offers access to basic functions of operation. Advanced control features are available using the remote control.


### **Power**


Turns unit on and off. When turned off, the disc transport moves into a secure position.


### Detail

The Detail is adjusted on the DV1000 remote control using the SETUP button. When the DVD player is stopped, the SETUP button functions as usual. Once the disc is playing the SETUP button then controls the detail level. Each press of the SETUP button toggles through the different settings: Off, Low, Medium, High, Off. The LEDs on the front panel accumulate as the level is increased.











**Open/Close:** Opens and closes disc tray.



**Skip Back:** Skips back to previous track or chapter.



**Play:** Starts reading of disc information. If the disc tray is open, pressing play will close tray and start disc transport.



**Pause:** Pauses playback. Repeat pressing operates as a frame by frame advance.



**Skip Forward:** Advances to next track or chapter.



**Stop:** Stops playback. If disc tray is open, it will close when pressed.

# **RS-232 Programming**

The DV1000 offers complete remote control via computer RS-232. The following commands should be used for system control.

- Each command string must start with "DV1000"
- Each command string ends with enter <CR>
- All commands can be strung together with commas
- <DEL> key can be used to correct errors.
- All RS-232 characters sent to DVD are echoed back.


# Playing Back a Disc




### Basic Playback

### ■ Preparations

- . When you want to play back DVD video discs, turn on the TV and select the video input source connected to the DVD video player.
- When you want to enjoy the sound of DVD video discs or audio CDs from the audio system, turn on the audio system and select the input source connected to the DVD video player.
- · For connection details, see pages 11 through 14.
- Set the playback picture size according to the aspect ratio of the connected TV. (See page 26.)
- If you do not have the necessary equipment to enjoy Dolby Digital (AC-3) sound, set the AUDIO SELECTOR at the rear panel to "PCM (ANALOG ON)."



- . Do not move the DVD video player during playback. Doing so may damage the disc.
- Use the OPEN/CLOSE button on the remote control or DVD video player to open and close the disc tray. Do not push the disc tray while it is moving. Doing so may cause the DVD video player to malfunction.
- . Do not push up on the disc tray or put any objects other than discs on the disc tray. Doing so may cause the DVD video player to malfunction.
- Keep your fingers well clear of the disc tray as it is closing. Be especially careful with children's fingers around the closing disc tray as there is a
  risk of personal injury.



### ■ To obtain a higher quality picture

Occasionally, some picture noise not usually displayed with a normal broadcast may appear on the TV screen while playing back a DVD video disc because the high resolution pictures on these discs include a lot of information. While the amount of noise depends on the TV you use with this DVD video player, you should reduce the sharpness adjustment on your TV from the position you usually set for normal broadcasts.


### Notes

 The DVD video player does not play back sound and subtitles during x2 or x8 the normal speed reverse and forward playback of DVD video discs.

However, the DVD video player plays back sound during fast forward or fast reverse playback of audio CDs.


### **Playing in Slow-Motion**





Press STOP at the location where you want to interrupt playback.



- The Last Play function is canceled when you press the SET UP button to display the SET UP MENU on the TV screen.
- The Last Play function is canceled when you stop playback in a title that includes multiple camera angles and press the ANGLE button (page 33).
- You cannot use the Last Play function while operating the disc menu.

# Locating a Specific Title, Chapter, or Track





Normally, DVD video discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters. Audio CDs are divided into tracks. You can quickly locate any specific title, chapter, or track.

### Locating a Title Using the Title Menu






### Press ▲/ ▼ to select the parental lock level, then press ENTER.

You cannot play back DVD video discs rated higher than the level you selected unless you cancel the parental lock function.

For example, when you select level 7, the discs rated higher than level 7 are locked out and cannot be played back.

e.g. When you select USA



The parental lock level is equivalent to the following USA movie ratings.

LEVEL 7: NC-17 LEVEL 3: PG LEVEL 6: R LEVEL 1: G

LEVEL 4: PG 13

The parental lock levels for "CAN" (Canada) are included for future use. Check the appropriate parental lock level when you buy a DVD video disc equipped with the parental lock function in the future.



### Press SET UP.

The SET UP MENU disappears.



### To change the parental lock level

You can change the parental lock level by following the steps in "Setting the Parental Lock." In step 3, press the **number buttons** to enter your 4-digit security code, then continue to step 4.

If you make a mistake, press the **CLEAR** button and enter the correct 4-digit security code.

### To change your 4-digit security code

You can change your 4-digit security code.

- 1 Follow steps 1 and 2 in "Setting the Parental Lock."
- 2 Press the STOP button four times while the security code menu appears on the TV screen.

The 4-digit security code is cleared.


- 3 Press the **number buttons** to create a new 4-digit security code, then press the **ENTER** button.
- 4 Complete steps 4 to 7 in "Setting the Parental Lock."

### To cancel the parental lock function

- 1 Follow steps 1 and 2 in "Setting the Parental Lock."
- 2 Press the number buttons to enter your 4-digit security code, then press the ENTER button.

If you make a mistake, press the **CLEAR** button and enter the correct 4-digit security code.

3 Press ◀ / ▶ to select "OFF," then press the ENTER button.



The SET UP MENU appears again.

4 Press the SET UP button.

The SET UP MENU disappears, and the parental lock function is cancelled.


- DVD video discs may or may not respond to the parental lock settings. Make sure this function works with your DVD video discs.
- If you press the RETURN button while a menu appears on the TV screen, you will return to the previous screen.

# Notes on Discs

This section shows you how to handle, clean, and store discs.

### **On Handling Discs**

· Do not touch the playback side of the disc.



Do not attach paper or tape to discs.



### On Cleaning Discs

 Fingerprints and dust on the disc cause picture and sound deterioration. Wipe the disc from the center outwards with a soft cloth. Always keep the disc clean.



- If you cannot wipe off the dust with a soft cloth, wipe the disc lightly with a slightly moistened soft cloth and finish with a dry cloth.
- Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner, benzine, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl LPs. It may damage the disc.

### **On Storing Discs**

- Do not store discs in a place subject to direct sunlight or near heat sources.
- Do not store discs in places subject to moisture and dust such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in a case. Stacking or placing objects on discs outside of their case may cause warping.

### **About This Owner's Manual**

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this DVD video player.

Some DVD video discs have functions that may not be explained in this owner's manual. Therefore, some instructions may differ from this owner's manual, and there may be extra instructions. In this case, follow the instructions displayed on the TV screen or package.
